Top of the eco-tree

A leading NZ lodge combines sumptuousness with sensitivity.

New Zealand's Treetops Lodge & Estate has won global acclaim as a landmark property in eco-tourism and conservation. Owner John Sax, who translated his love of nature into the spectacular wilderness estate, recently addressed 5000 delegates from around the world at the Greenbuild eco-expo in Portland, Oregon, US. A number of the world's leading architects and conservationists selected Treetops Lodge & Estate as a prime example of a tourist property creating environmental and cultural awareness. Situated just 20km from Rotorua – the geothermal and Maori cultural centre of New Zealand – the luxury lodge lies in the heart of 1000 hectares of native

forest, game reserve and cascading springs. The spectacular eco-adventure hideaway features seven trout streams, four lakes and more than 70km of trails through scenic terrain and ancient forests. The lodge itself is crafted from natural materials, and its front door opens onto a bridge over a trout stream. Says Sax: "It was my dream that perhaps we could build a sanctuary – a place that reflected the very best of what there was to offer – where all could come and appreciate the beauty of nature, be refreshed and depart a little brighter for the experience."
